# QORC MotoGP RACING COMPETITION

## Objective:

- As most people are staying at home during the COVID - 19 emergency, the objective will be to host an online racing competition to bring together the motor racing community.

## Format:

- This competition will be held on the **MotoGP 19 PS4** game
- MotoGP 19 has a Custom Lobby Feature called Race Director Mode where the host can create a race format to his preference.
- The race format will consist of **Qualifying (15 minutes)** and a **Race (30 mins)** where the **best track position wins**.
- Points will be awarded **in the race only**
- In one Custom Lobby you can have up to **14 riders** and **one Race Director**, who will be observing the race from Spectate Mode and he can scroll through all the different camera angles for each rider.

## Overview:

- The idea is to host this competition across **two** weeks.
- The first week consists of **'Qualifying Rounds'** for the **Finals** which will take place in the second week.
- Each rider will do **three** qualifying races in week one.
- The **top 12 riders** with the most points after the first week qualify for the Finals.

### Points Format:

- The points format we will use is as follows:

1st	40 points
2nd	36 points
3rd	33 points
4th	31 points
5th	30 points
6th	29 points
7th	28 points
8th	27 points
9th	26 points
10th	25 points
11th	24 points
12th	23 points
13th	22 points
14th	21 points

\*In the case of a tiebreaker, the rider's best lap time from the race is compared to the rider he is tied on points with. The rider with the faster lap time will finish ahead of the rider he is tied on points with\*

### Qualifying Rounds & Finals:

- The **maximum** number of riders we can host in this competition is **42 riders**
- Riders will be split into **three groups** : Group A, Group B and Group C with each group having maximum of **14 riders**
- Each rider is expected to join the **three** ‘Qualifying Rounds’ taking place in week one
- After that, the **top 4 riders from each group** will qualify to go to the finals
- The Qualifying Rounds and Finals will take place on **Sunday, Tuesday** and **Thursday** in Week One and Week Two respectively
- Since this competition will take place in the month of Ramadan, races will start at night from 9 PM onwards

Example of the event timetable when hosting a race:

#### Week One: Qualifying Rounds

Selected Day: Sunday

Group A - <b>14 Riders</b>	9:00 pm - 10:00 pm
Group B - <b>14 Riders</b>	10:30 pm - 11:30 pm
Group C - <b>14 Riders</b>	12:00 am - 1:00 am

*\*A 30 minute break in between Heats is required for setting up the new Heat and change overtime\**

### **Rules & Regulations for On-Track racing:**

- Since MotoGP 19 is the official MotoGP game, it consists of all of the FIM rules to ensure clean racing, as well as giving appropriate penalties when necessary to riders who violate the regulations.
- For Bike collisions, the game will judge the incident and the award appropriate penalties. The host has the option to set penalties to the strict setting.
- If a rider is track extending and not adhering to the track limits, the game will invalidate that lap time. If the rider continues to track extended, the game will issue the rider a penalty.

### **Bike Regulations:**

- The performance of the riders bikes will be **equal**
- MotoGP 19 has a Balance of Performance feature enabling all bikes to have equal performance
- The rider however, has the choice to choose a bike from any of the **six** Moto GP 2019 season teams

### **Track Selection:**

- The only tracks available to use in MotoGP 19 are the same 19 tracks from the real life 2019 MotoGP season
- There is also the option to use three 'historical circuits' which are Donington Park, Laguna Seca and Barcelona Catalunya

### Registration for the competition:

- There will be an official announcement post on QMMF's social media pages to inform the motor racing community about the Online Racing Competition
- The riders will join a WhatsApp group where all of the event information is posted
- This will ensure a simple registration method for the riders, as well as for the host who can keep count the amount of riders joining the competition
- Each rider will have to send a friend request on PlayStation to the QMMF account as this is the account we will host each race from

### Conclusion:

After a successful start to the Qatar Online Racing Championship last month on GT Sport, this competition will cater to those who love motorbike racing.

This will be a unique competition because the last MotoGP Esports event was when the actual MotoGP riders took to their PlayStations to race each other on a similar race format we'll be using for the duration of the QMMF event.

Once again QMMF have taken a great initiative to host a competition under the current situation. This is the best way to continue motor racing and to involve the community by setting up a simple form of competition.
