2022 QATAR OFF-ROAD CHAMPIONSHIP (Motorcycles)
GENERAL REGULATIONS / Appendix 1 – "Survival" specific regulations

Start procedures (update)

The start will be given at a location no more than 300 metres outside of the circuit and marked to connect it to the circuit. The start will be mass start with dead engine machines positioned in a straight line and riders standing off the machines at a distance of more than 20 metres.

Start signal for all riders at the same time will be given by means of a clearly waved flag and klaxon horn. Countdown timing boards will be displayed.

Considering the high number of quads entered for Round 5 and for safety reasons, the mass start will be organised in two lines, the front one reserved for motorcycles and the rear one for quads.

The start for quads will take place exactly 1 (one) minute after the start for the motorcycles.

Start signal for quad riders will be similar to the one used for motorcycles (clearly waved flag and klaxon horn), but only the 15" timing board will be displayed.

Service & Refuelling (update)

Any competitor wishing to access the service area or the refuelling area during the competitive element of the event must stop for at least for 3 seconds at a well identified 'box' located at the entrance of each of the areas the pit lane.

Any competitor exiting the pit lane during the competitive element of the event must stop for at least for 3 seconds at a well identified 'box' located immediately before the access to the track.

The time spent on any of these operations will not be deducted from the total time of the competitor.

Duration of the event (update)

For all competitors (motorcycles and quads),

- the event will conclude 60 minutes plus 1 lap after the start of the motorcycles or 75 minutes after that start whichever happens first.
- to be classified he must conclude a minimum of 50% of the laps of his class winner.
- only completed laps will be counted for the classification.
